Definition of Terms:

Staffed Beds

Beds available for immediate patient overnight care with appropriate staff available.

Admissions

Formal acceptance of an inpatient who receives room, board, and nursing care and stays at least overnight.

Employees (full-time equivalent)

Refers to the number of full-time employees plus one-half the number of part-time employees.
